TRAIL MANNERS

Good manners is the grease that helps people get along with each other, avoiding friction.

- **UNDER 16 MUST WEAR A HELMET.**
- Be aware of the effect **your** actions have on others, their horses and their property.
- Do not upset your co-riders' horses.
- Ride at a quiet, controlled pace.
- **NEVER PASS OTHERS AT A GALLOP.**
- Keep a safe distance... don't crowd others.
- **STAY WITH A DISMOUNTED RIDER**
- Respect the property of others. (ie: lawns, farm fields, crops, groves, livestock, etc.)
- Leave gates as you found them: Open gates should remain open. Closed gates should remain closed.
- **DO NOT PASS THE TRAIL BOSS or drop behind the drag rider.**
- Stay with the trail boss on the same side of the road. Do not split the road.
- Clean up after your horse. Pick up manure or spread it depending on where you are. Do not clean your trailers out when you unload.
- **NO PROFANITY AT ANY SFTR EVENTS.**

REMEMBER! If you mind your manners others won't mind when you and your horse return to ride.

IRMAGEDDON IN FLORIDA

All rides and events for SFTR after Sept. 8th to the end of September were



We lost contact with each other for a short time. We did our best to keep tabs on our friends and members throughout the whole thing and fortunately all got through it well although some with physical damage and losses. Many of our members were posting to Facebook so we knew they were OK. Others sent messages or made phone calls. The few we didn't hear from were quick to advise as soon as they could.

Although most of us got off easy a few had roof damage fences down and enormous tree and debris clean up on both sides of south Florida. The west got the eye and the east got mini tornados that caused similar damage. It also nice that in times of need we come together, many have helped one another, sharing supplies and services as well as putting us up when we are wandering around looking for a place to crash. Trail riders are resourceful and camped at home for days while power was restored. Nothing like Andrew, as many that were here then will agree.



Then some of us suffered mental anguish over decisions made. Ok, not some of us, me. We all remember that the path Irma was approaching was to put the eye right over south Miami Dade, so after waiting on line at the gas station for hours to get some diesel for my truck I decided to take my horses to the safety of the west coast, after all they would only get the outer bands with less winds and rains. Good idea, so I did that. I came home very satisfied I did what was necessary to protect my horses. We had shutters on the house, lots of water, enough food for a week or more, I brought home my camping generator, and found batteries for the radio. We were ready, so I went to sleep.

The next morning I woke to the weather reports showing Irma's sudden turn under the state and north up the west coast, right where my horses were. I couldn't believe it! I put them in harms way! What should I do now? There wasn't anyone at the barn where they are boarded. I might hit tons of evacuating traffic. And who knows if I'll find help along the way if needed. What should I do? What can I do? For the next two days I called or messaged everyone I knew in the Naples area, power was out, cell towers were down and communication was nonexistent. Suffer, pace, worry, pace and suffer. Finally people found that if they drove closer to town the cells worked. I got the message that I wanted for two days, "your horses and trailer are 100% OK". Yesssssssss!



Oh, we lost our fence at home, it was old and rickety, so we are forced to walk the dogs two or three times a day, oh, the pain! Lol!

KNOW YOUR HORSE - Part 4 -



KNOW YOUR HORSE – BODY CONDITION

KNOW YOUR HORSE – RESPIRATORY RATE

This is the fourth in a series of educational articles to help you get to know your horse. This article will explain what the normal respiratory rate range (respirations or number of breaths) is for an adult horse and how to get it.

You should have an idea what is normal for your horse, at rest and after exercise. Changes can be an indication of a problem and early detection of a change can make the difference between treating and resolving a problem quickly versus long term illness and expensive treatment

The normal respiratory rate range for an adult horse is 10 to 24 breaths per minute. There are two ways a horse owner can determine their horses' respiratory rate.

The rate can be determined by observing the movements of the horses' flanks



The rate can also be determined by observing the movements of the horses' nostrils



Use a watch with a second hand and count the movements for one minute. Measure the respiratory rate for your horse both at rest and after exercise and keep a record.

The article in next month's issue will show you how to determine your horses heart rate.

Flor was rescued with 5 other horses from the 8.5/East Everglades in SW Miami-Dade on June 28, 2017. She and the others were unconfined/at large, posing a danger to themselves and the public. Charges have been filed by police against the owner.

Upon examination by our veterinarian, Flor was diagnosed with Indigo poisoning and noted she is blind or nearly blind. The young filly is malnourished, and very unsteady on her feet due to probable neurological damage from the poisoning. We're doing everything we can for her, and hope for some improvement in her condition. Please check back soon for updates.

Flor_08162017_DSC_18948/5/17 UPDATE: We are very happy to announce that Flor has recovered completely from Indigo poisoning, which had caused her temporary blindness. She is active and healthy, spending her days out in the pasture with her other pony friends and her evenings in her comfy stall. She has just learned how to lead, and is doing great at it. We could not be more relieved or happy for her! For those interested, Flor will be available for adoption very soon. Stay tuned!

9/1/17 UPDATE: Flor is now officially available for adoption! Our adorable young mini has stolen our hearts, she's an absolute sweetheart with a big personality. Honestly, we should put a warning label on her: "Exposure to Flor, even in limited amounts, can reduce most to mush and result in the overwhelming desire to adopt her on the spot."

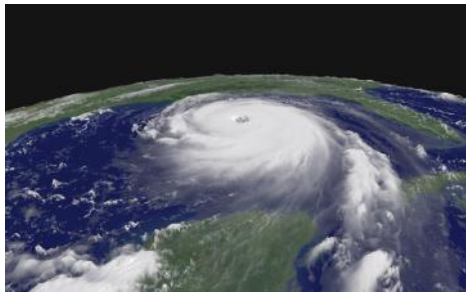

Deda reads the Brazilian news online. She came across an article by a Brazilian reporter living in Florida during Irma's visit. The view from the perspective of a foreigner was very interesting.

He watched as the media warned us and reported many days in advance the dangers that could be expected. He observed that the recent flooding due to Harvey in Houston made people ever more concerned. The preparation was fast and furious. He spoke of being wrapped up in the search for and acquisition of all the needs, the long lines for gas, the shortages of food and water in the supermarkets.



His final observation was that if he had to be in a natural disaster, he would prefer to face it in the USA and even better in Florida.

TROPICAL PARK HURRICANE STALLS

First! Reserve your stalls with Debi Cat-Priest at 305-775-1820. When a Hurricane Watch goes into effect, the barn manager, Pablo Tejeda, will attempt to reach everyone to confirm that you will take possession of your stall. If unsuccessful, he will reassign your stall for that hurricane to someone else. Do not call Pablo unless a Watch is in effect, his number is 305-554-7334 and leave a message.

Your reservation fee per stall is \$26.00. This reserves a stall for the 2017 Hurricane Season. Once a Hurricane Watch goes into effect and you take possession of your stall, on the 25th hour you will owe Miami-Dade County an additional daily fee, plus an additional \$26.00 to re-reserve your stall for the remainder of the 2017 Season.

Upon arrival, Pablo will need to see your Coggins papers. Suggested items are flashlight, buckets with clips for water, (muck buckets work), a fly mask, your name, horse's name and phone #'s taped to your stall doors, halter, written on your horse, a bale of hay to put in the stall so the horse has something to keep him busy all the hours he is there etc.

You can't leave anything but your horse at Tropical Park.

Depending on the storm's estimated arrival, Miami-Dade County will lock the park gates. Once the Hurricane Watch is lifted, you have 48 hours to remove your horse. All stalls must be cleaned before leaving or an additional charge per stall will be applied and you will be unable to reserve stalls in the future.

Hope to see you on the trail – not at Tropical Park!
