TRAIL MANNERS

Good manners is the grease that helps people get along with each other, avoiding friction.

- 18 & UNDER MUST WEAR A HELMET.
- Be aware of the effect **your** actions have on others, their horses and their property.
- Do not upset your co-riders' horses.
- Ride at a quiet, controlled pace.
- NEVER PASS OTHERS AT A GALLOP.
- Keep a safe distance... don't crowd others.
- STAY WITH A DISMOUNTED RIDER
- Respect the property of others. (ie: lawns, farm fields, crops, groves, livestock, etc.)
- Leave gates as you found them: Open gates should remain open. Closed gates should remain closed.
- DO NOT PASS THE TRAIL BOSS or drop behind the drag rider.
- Stay with the trail boss on the same side of the road. Do not split the road.
- Clean up after your horse. Pick up manure or spread it depending on where you are. Do not clean your trailers out when you unload.
- NO PROFANITY AT ANY SFTR EVENTS.

REMEMBER! If you mind your manners others won't mind when you and your horse return to ride.





The Pine Lake Ride Takes You Deep into the Everglades

Each year the SFTR rides deep into the Everglades Natl. Park, through narrow trails lined with palmettos, out into the high grasslands, through tall stands of pines & high up onto the deer mounds. There is even an old python boneyard from past elimination hunts! This is the **Pine Lake Ride**, an amazing horseback trek, & will be on **Sat.**, **Feb. 10**.

To help travelers avoid getting lost, you can meet 8:30-9am at Robert is Here fruit stand in Fla. City, (192 Ave & SW 344 St). From Krome/177Av. or Redland Rd/187 Av.- go west on Palm Dr./344 St. The caravan will leave at 9am. Pine Lake is located 9mi inside the park after the toll booth entrance. Set your odometer so that at 9mi you can slow

down, or you will miss the dirt road to the lake on your left! The main road is narrow with no place to turn a rig around...so don't miss the turn!! Arrive at Pine Lake at 9:30am, ride out at 10:30am, for approx 2hrs.

Be self-sufficient for this outback adventure. Bring your own water/snack/lunch/bug spray & wear your SFTR T-shirt in case we pass others on the trail! The ride is rocky, so equine boots/shoes are suggested. Juniors 18-under **must** wear a helmet. Water will be provided. This ride is special, so call a fellow SFTR to trailer with you & see the real Fla. as only we can – on horseback!

Emergency Management – Don't Let Your Horse Eat These 6 Things

Be careful what treats & different foods to give a horse. Some foods seem attractive to a horse, but may be toxic & can make them very sick.. Treats are a good way of maintaining the bond between you & your horse. However, be careful about what treats/foods. Horses lack the awareness & discipline to reject certain foods, so it is up to us to monitor the type & quantity of food that a horse consumes.

If you are a horse owner, or regularly feed horses, you should have a good understanding about what is ok & not ok to give a horse. Here are some of the main things to avoid giving a horse:

Meat - Horses are herbivores. Their entire digestive system is designed to **only** process a plant based diet. This means their digestive system cannot process meat & they do not have the necessary teeth to break it down. The exact affect of meat on their digestive system differs from horse to horse. If they are regularly given meat it will almost certainly have a negative effect on their health in the long term. There is no need to panic if a horse eats a scrap of meat that someone has dropped – the horse will not become instantly sick from a piece of meat.

Large Amounts of Fruit and Vegetables - Many people like to give horses treats, like apples. Horses love the sweet taste of fruit & will constantly look for more. Apples & some other fruits are ok in small quantities, but can be hazardous in large amounts. Too many apples/fruit could result in colic which can lead to more serious gastro issues, such as colonic ulcers. Long term effects of sugars can hasten Cushings/diabetes & related lamenitis, founder & other issues. Take extra care if your horse resides in an agricultural area where they could potentially get access to sprayed crops or trees bearing fruit.

Lawn Mower/Garden Clippings - It's not uncommon for people to empty lawn mower or garden clippings in horse pastures. However, be careful to ensure that the horse never have access to mower or garden clippings. Lawn mower & garden clippings can be dangerous for a number of reasons. Fresh lawn clippings are often warm, meaning they are in a state of fermentation. This same thing happens in the horses stomach when they eat grass. However, when they are clipped they are already chopped up & the horse can swallow without chewing, breaking it down with saliva. This means the clippings are already fermenting when they reach the horses stomach. (Usually this happens much later in the digestive process). The fermenting grass in the stomach produces gas which then expands. This in turn can result in severe abdominal pain & colic (which can be fatal in some instances.) Garden clippings may be dangerous depending on the tree/plant they have been cut off. There are many plants & trees that are poisonous to horses! Horses may not separate potentially toxic clippings from other clippings when feeding, so there is a risk the horse could ingest something that could severely harm them.

Poor Quality Hay - When the quality of hay that a horse gets is consistently bad, it can have serious negative affects on their health. Hay that contains dust or mold spores can lead to breathing complications, which can severely impact their overall health & quality of life. Another danger from bad hay is that horses are less likely to consume sufficient quantities of it. As this happens they may miss out on key nutrients, such as fiber. If they don't get sufficient fiber they will not maintain their weight & their body may stop producing the same level of heat. This could result in them feeling cold & having reduced energy. Gastro-intestinal issues may also de-

velop. To avoid these problems, consistently check the quality of their hay.

Cole Crops - Cole crops are cruciferous vegetables, including kale, broccoli, brussel sprouts, & other similar green leaf vegetables. These vegetables can be quite gassy when consumed & the gas can then expand & put pressure on a horses stomach. A horse may get a mild to severe bout of colic, depending on the quantity of cole crops consumed. Just like lawn/garden clippings, take care when disposing of large amounts of these vegetables.

Cattle Feed - It is commonplace to see horses & cattle grazing on the same pasture. They may also share the same hay & water. However they have very different digestive systems & very different dietary needs. This means a horse should **never** be given grain based feed that is designed for cows. Urea is a non-protein nitrogen source that is commonly found in the diets of ruminant animals ,such as cattle. Horses cannot break down urea into carbon dioxide & ammonia in the same way cattle do. This means it can remain in their system & become toxic. Urea can result in serious illness for horses & can even be fatal. Other ingredients found in cattle feed (such as Rumensin & Bovatex) are also poisonous to horses & can also result in serious illness and fatalities.

So avoid an emergency, be a knowledgeable horse care-giver, and help your equines live a wonderful life.
