

TRAIL MANNERS

Good manners is the grease that helps people get along with each other avoiding friction.

- **UNDER 16 MUST WEAR A HELMET.**
- Be aware of the effect **your** actions have on others, their horses and their property.
- Do not upset your co-rider's horses.
- Ride at a quiet, controlled pace.
- **NEVER PASS OTHERS AT A GALLOP.**
- Keep a safe distance... don't crowd others.
- **STAY WITH A DISMOUNTED RIDER**
- Respect the property of others. (ie: lawns, farm fields, crops, groves, livestock, etc.)
- Leave gates as you found them: Open gates should remain open. Closed gates should remain closed.
- **DO NOT PASS THE TRAIL BOSS or drop behind the drag rider.**
- Stay with the trail boss on the same side of the road. Do not split the road.
- Clean up after your horse. Pick up manure or spread it depending on where you are. Do not clean your trailers out when you unload.
- **NO PROFANITY ON ANY SFTR EVENTS.**

REMEMBER! If you mind your manners others won't mind when you and your horse return to ride.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE





TROPICAL PARK HURRICANE STALLS

Yes, Hurricane Season is here and following are a few things to consider. When a Hurricane Watch goes into effect, the barn manager, Pablo Tejeda, will attempt to reach everyone to confirm that you will take possession of your stall. If unsuccessful, he will reassign your stall for that hurricane to someone else. Please call him either way at 305-554-7334 and leave a message.

Your reservation fee per stall is \$26.00. This reserves a stall for the 2013 Hurricane Season. Once a Hurricane Watch goes into effect and you take possession of your stall, on the 25th hour you will owe Miami-Dade County an additional daily fee, plus an additional \$26.00 to re-reserve your stall for the remainder of the 2013 Season.

Upon arrival, Pablo will need to see your Coggins papers. Suggested items are flashlight, buckets with clips for water, (muck buckets work), a fly mask, your name, horse's name and phone #'s taped to your stall doors, halter, written on your horse, etc.

You can't leave anything but your horse at Tropical Park.

Depending on the storm's estimated arrival, Miami-Dade County will lock the park gates. Once the Hurricane Watch is lifted, you have 48 hours to remove your horse. All stalls must be cleaned before leaving or an additional charge per stall will be applied and you will be unable to reserve stalls in the future.

Hope to see you on the trail – not at Tropical Park!

BE A TRAIL-BOSS IT'S EASIER THAN YOU THINK!

In the old times the trail boss had to cut back thickets while wandering in unfamiliar territory – defending against predators and enemies, in foul weather, with little more than a rip of dried meat and a brick-hard piece of bread. That was then, and although we credit many a tough muleskinner and cattlemoan with blazing such trails, the SFTR has a little more modern twist to the routine.

Some of our members would like to host a ride, but are intimidated by the “unknown” process. Your easiest venue is to host a ride from your own barn (no trailering for you!) Most of us ride the same general fields, groves and quiet paths and are familiar with the best route to avoid killer dogs, spooky crop ground plastic, human catching spider web zones and groves with knock-you-off-your-horse branches. But these same members hesitate to host a ride because they have no GPS to verify the route for ride miles credit. Never fear...your SFTR Board is here. We will co-chair a ride with you and show you the ropes if needed.

So get a buddy and check with Andrea for a date. Pick a trail you frequent or ask a seasoned rider for help. Make it simple and advertise the ride as a covered dish, or bring your own sandwich. You handle the ice, water, drinks, etc (ask Andrea how). It is a normal ride for you, out of your barn...but for everyone else it is an exciting ride in new territory with good friends!

As I drove down to the barn I encountered a huge rainstorm on the turnpike, but at 6:00am I thought, good, it'll be done by 8:00am. Well it followed me. On and off it rained through the Redlands and into Homestead. But Americans would not be de-toured. More than 20 Trail Riders showed up, some from as far as Broward and some that took off work but all of them were early at their barn to load horses and make the drive in the rain to support this worthy cause.

In the end it was called off due to the rainstorm and lightning being closer than 6 miles and heading our way.

We didn't walk or ride, but we all felt deep in our hearts, NEVER FORGET!!!!


THE GOOD FOOT AT A GLANCE

Article 5 – Collateral Grooves . . . aka Collateral Sulci / Lateral and Medial Grooves

This is the fifth in a series of articles about the visible anatomy of the equine hoof. As each horse is unique, the descriptions used will be basic and generally thought to be acceptable by veterinarians, farriers, and barefoot trimmers. This is meant to be a guideline to help you recognize a good foot or a potential problem. I am a barefoot enthusiast with nine barefoot horses and have recently completed a yearlong course on applied equine podiatry. The articles are edited by Zachary Franklin, DVM.

Definition of Collateral Grooves/Collateral Sulci/Lateral & Medial Grooves: The grooves located adjacent to and running parallel to the frog (the seam or crease between the frog and the bars). See illustration below.

Description: The collateral grooves between the frog and the bars follow the concavity of the sole and are usually deeper at the back of the hoof, sloping upward toward the apex of the frog. They are sometimes used to estimate sole thickness. In a healthy, fully functional hoof the average depth at the apex of the frog would be about 10 to 20mm off the ground (not including wall height). The distance off the ground at the back, adjacent to the bars at their deepest point, would be about 15 to 30mm. Very deep collateral grooves can be an indication of excessive false sole. Very shallow collateral grooves can be an indication of thin sole. It is important to clean the collateral grooves when picking out the hoof. They tend to trap dirt, manure, stones and are often the starting point for thrush and canker. ~Susan Boyd

IS YOUR HORSE FULL OF HOT AIR

Remember when you were a beginning rider and told that those crafty school horses were "puffing up" and filling their bellies with air to keep their girths loose? All those slipping saddles seemed proof enough that breath holding was a genuine equine skill. Sorry, that tale is just a bunch of hot air.

Given the arrangement of the horse's first 10 ribs, upon which the saddle sits, it is impossible for a horse to appreciably increase his girth diameter with a deep breath. Horses are also very reluctant to hold their breaths under any circumstances and certainly not for all the time you spend fumbling with the cinch or girth during tacking up. The "puffer" does enlarge his girth, but it occurs when he tenses the muscles in his chest and abdomen, just as you do when you anticipate a blow to the belly.

Relaxation is the way to "deflate" the horse. Place the saddle on his back and attach the girth lightly. Walk him around a bit or do a little more grooming until the tension is out of his torso. Tighten the girth gradually. A little more walking should have him back normal size before the final tightening. By making saddling and girthing an innocuous, if not pleasant experience, you may convince your horse he doesn't need to "puff up" in self-defense.
