TRAIL MANNERS

Good manners is the grease that helps people get along with each other, avoiding friction.

- 18 & UNDER MUST WEAR A HELMET.
- Be aware of the effect **your** actions have on others, their horses and their property.
- Do not upset your co-riders' horses.
- Ride at a quiet, controlled pace.
- NEVER PASS OTHERS AT A GALLOP.
- Keep a safe distance... don't crowd others.
- STAY WITH A DISMOUNTED RIDER
- Respect the property of others. (ie: lawns, farm fields, crops, groves, livestock, etc.)
- Leave gates as you found them: Open gates should remain open. Closed gates should remain closed.
- DO NOT PASS THE TRAIL BOSS or drop behind the drag rider.
- Stay with the trail boss on the same side of the road. Do not split the road.
- Clean up after your horse. Pick up manure or spread it depending on where you are. Do not clean your trailers out when you unload.
- NO PROFANITY AT ANY SFTR EVENTS.

REMEMBER! If you mind your manners others won't mind when you and your horse return to ride.



We would like to thank Lt. Chris Pecori, of the Venom 1 unit, for an amazing presentation about the work being done by our famous MDFR Venom 1 unit. The April discussion had both visual info & live snakes, & was packed with information for our club's great turnout. Some of our members also had a chance to handle non-venomous snakes after the meeting!

Our next General Meeting will be **Tues. May 7**, during which we will hear all about the invasive snakes, lizards, spiders, other critters you might see while riding in our locale. Scheduled to speak is Dr. Mary Yong Cong, a biological scientist specializing in invasive species, through the Fla. Dept. of Agriculture. Dr. Cong will explain how to identify creatures that we would most like encounter. Info also on signs & symptoms if you or your horse are bitten, & treatment options. So do your part to help save our na-

tive flora & fauna - come to this meeting to learn what you can do to stop invasive species that threaten our native creatures.

Remember, we meet on the **first Tuesday** of each month, so our next **General Meeting** will be **Tues. May 7**, at the **Homestead VFW** post. Black Horse Ranch

I've wanted to camp and ride the Black Horse Ranch and finally got my chance. As it turns out many of our SFTR members have moved to that area. Marsha Schlosser, our founding SFTR president, suggested we gather for dinner at the indoor pavilion at Black Horse, we agreed, and Marsha passed the invitation to those in the area. It was so great getting together with former members, several I had never met. Each person shared their story of what initially brought them to the club, some were very funny stories. Emergency Management - Hikers, Bikers and Horses, Oh My!

As we all are getting back on the trail as vacations from school & jobs begin, and with hiking & biking becoming much more popular, our trails are becoming a bit busier with folks who don't live in rural areas. Here is how to share the trails with equines in a manner that is safe for everyone.

Often a non-confident rider will seem grumpy, but that is sometimes simply because they are nervous about an encounter on the trail. Remember, the trail etiquette is that horses/mules ALWAYS have the right of way. But non-equestrians often show their ignorance of this law, assuming any trail, paved or not, belongs to them. It is possible for everyone to have a fun, safe hike, horseback ride, or cycle trip on the same trail, with a little courtesy & understanding. Last, but not least, respect each others trails. Hikers/bikers do not enjoy trails churned up by hooves or poop & most horse trails must be shared, so courtesy goes both ways.

Hikers: If you see a rider coming, step to the side of the trail & turn to face the trail. Do NOT hide behind a tree or bush. Horses are prey animals & think you are waiting to pounce on them! If you have a back-pack, your pack should face away from the animal & try not to move a lot, so that the pack does not "wave" at them. Speak to the rider. Say anything - talk about the weather, the trail, how pretty the horse/mule is, whatever. This lets the animal know you are a human & not a predator. Listen to the rider & assume all horses/mules could be ter-

rified of you. Many are not, but that one anxious equine could hurt both the rider & potentially the hiker. If it is safe enough to do so, hikers should step to the low side of the trail. In the instance an animal spooks, there is less chance of the rider/horse going over the edge (into a canal, into a roadway, etc). If an animal is afraid of the hiker, it is not going to hit the hiker, but a person above their heads (up on a rock, hill, etc.) becomes a predator. Also, if you have hiking poles, place them in one hand, if possible, & try not to "talk with your hands"! Waving poles are like whips that are often use in training. Such aids ask the animal to move & that's not always what we're going for in an encounter on the trail.

Bikers: Most of the time if a cyclist simply stops, that is ok. Many bikers will not only stop, but dismount as well. There have been very conscientious bikers with dogs step way off of the trail, set the bike down & make the dogs lay down as well. Again, listen to the rider, & bikers should follow the hints for hikers.

Enjoy the outdoors! Also remember, if you use the bathroom out in the great outdoors, either pack out your toilet paper or bury it. No one likes to see it on the trail. Stuff it in a used baggie & throw it away at the trail head if you cannot bury it. You will not die doing so. If you find it that disgusting, you do not belong out in the great outdoors. Sharing the trails with courtesy & respect for others and for Nature, will help to maintain equestrian use of such trails for us all.


