



TRAIL MANNERS

Good manners is the grease that helps people get along with each other, avoiding friction.

- 18 & UNDER MUST WEAR A HELMET.
- Be aware of the effect **your** actions have on others, their horses and their property.
- Do not upset your co-riders' horses.
- Ride at a quiet, controlled pace.
- NEVER PASS OTHERS AT A GALLOP.
- Keep a safe distance... don't crowd others.
- STAY WITH A DISMOUNTED RIDER
- Respect the property of others. (ie: lawns, farm fields, crops, groves, livestock, etc.)
- Leave gates as you found them: Open gates should remain open. Closed gates should remain closed.
- DO NOT PASS THE TRAIL BOSS or drop behind the drag rider.
- Stay with the trail boss on the same side of the road. Do not split the road.
- Clean up after your horse. Pick up manure or spread it depending on where you are. Do not clean your trailers out when you unload.
- NO PROFANITY AT ANY SFTR EVENTS.

REMEMBER! If you mind your manners others won't mind when you and your horse return to ride.



Come to our General Meeting, Tues. April 2, to hear all about the venomous snakes & other critters to avoid while riding in our locale. Lt. Chris Pecori, of the Venom 1 unit, will explain how to identify venomous snakes, spiders, scorpions, etc that we would most likely encounter. Info also on signs & symptoms if you or your horse are bitten, & treatment options. **Venom 1** is the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue team that responds to your call when you are in need of immediate care. By land, sea or in the air – they are there to save your life! So do your part and come to this meeting to learn what you can do to avoid being bitten & help yourself (or your horse) until Venom 1 can reach you.

Remember, we meet on the **first Tuesday** of each month, so our next **General Meeting** will be **Tues. Apr. 2**, at the **Homestead VFW** post. The VFW is where we park for the Veteran's parade: 601 N.E. 2 Rd. (Campbell Dr./312 St. & then go south at the light at 1st Rd.; east of Krome, just west of US1). Dine **7pm**, meeting **7:30pm**- the room is spacious, the food is good & very reasonable. Bring your friends, we welcome them to come meet our great club members, hear about our up-coming calendar of events & learn important life saving info from **Venom 1**. THE MEANING OF....RSVP

When a ride or event is advertised, you are being invited to an event & we try to let the reader know as much important information about the activity as possible. The name & location of the ride, arrival & ride out times, duration of the ride, & sometimes the trail conditions or special info for the event. We list who will host or Trail Boss the activity & give contact information. General info such as facilities, extra gear to take, even info about lunch, sodas & water. We try to let the member know as many details which would help answer questions they may have concerning the up-coming event. It is hoped the info is helpful to the reader. At the end of the article you will see......RSVP, & the contact info for the Trail Boss.

What does **RSVP** mean? It is French...repondez s'il vous plait. Translated to English it means "please reply".....or in common terms: Please **call** the TB & let them know you are going to their event!!!!

Why do we ask you to **RSVP**? The Trail Boss needs to know how many people will attend so they can prepare water/sodas & food. If side-dishes are to be brought to share, it is nice to know what's coming in, so 10 people don't all bring chips. Maybe the TB wants to have a token or surprise for the riders – a head count would be helpful. Maybe the **RSVP** helps the TB plan parking of all the trailers on their property – which is easier if they know how many big or small rigs are coming. And an important issue here in so. Fla...when you **RSVP/call** the TB ahead of time, IF the TB must cancel the ride due to rain or an emergency, they can call YOU before you load up & drive!!

So please **RSVP**. Please take a courtesy-moment to **call/text/Facebook/email** the TB to let them know you will attend. If your plans change, that's ok (maybe you can let them know). It is the only way the TB knows WHO to call back quickly, if an event is canceled!
